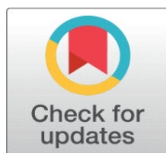
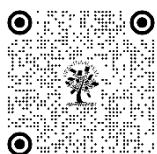

- **Corruption and Injustice:** The film talks about the corrupt political system and the use of high force to resolve problems, presenting Gandhian ideals as a more peaceful alternative.
- **Social Message:** The movie encourages the audience to reconsider old-fashioned ideas of heroism and success, motivating the use of moral principles to bring about change.

#### **3 Idiots (2009)**

## PK (2014)

- **Caste and Social Divide:** The film indirectly critiques the social constructs created by caste and religion, showing their effects on human relationships.
- **Social Message:** The film promotes critical thinking and a more scientific, realistic approach to life, leading people to question societal norms and religious practices that do not contribute to human welfare.

Rajkumar Hirani's films showcases a significant shift in the storytelling style of commercial Hindi cinema. While mainstream hindi cinema usually focused on love stories, heroism, and family drama, Hirani's films are known to have social issues, making them both entertaining and thought-provoking. His art of having that blended humor with social commentary allows these serious issues to be raised in a light-hearted yet impactful manner, along with making them accessible to a wide audience.

Hirani's films also challenge traditional notions of masculinity and heroism (Majumdar, 2010). In Munnabhai M.B.B.S., the protagonist is known to have strength not in his physically but in his compassion and empathy. Similarly, 3 Idiots has broke the norms of the stereotypical macho figures of the heroes and put them in shoe of students who dare to challenge the system to follow their dreams.

Hirani's film redefined the role of the Hindi film hero, making him a catalyst for social change. Heroes are not fighting love and justice but for a better, improved society. They question established norms, such as rigid educational practices and blind religious faith, and promote a more human-centered approach to life.
