Poacher produced by executive producer Alia Bhatt and streaming on Prime Video- dramatizes Operation Shikar, which led to one of the largest ivory conquered (around 500 kgs) in the country. In Malayatoor, an aging forest watcher, drunk and beliefs-deeply affected, confesses to his participation in the robbery of raw ivory. His whistleblowing exposes the outline of a larger ring, from the foothills of the Western Ghats to the pristine art galleries of Delhi. - **Predictability:** A few critics mentioned that certain plot points were predictable, which slightly diminished the overall suspense and impact of the series.


3) Emotional Intensity:

While there are areas for improvement, the series succeeds in raising awareness and fostering a deeper understanding of wildlife conservation, making it a valuable and impactful addition to Amazon Prime's catalog.
